Collect dried berries and open to expose seeds. Soak seeds in vinegar for 20 min. Then soak in warm water(120' F) for up to 2 hours. Plant seeds ½" deep in a well drained planting medium. Keep it moist and in the shade.

Germination: approx. 3-6 months. After seedlings form, gradually acclimate them to full sun.

Fruit is not edible, strung into leis. Leaves were used for medicines. Wood was used to cremate outlaws,

Break open seed pods to collect seeds, snip off tips of seeds then soak in water for 5-10 min. Plant in soil, allow 3-4 weeks for germination.

Uses: Mamane is one of the hardest, long-lasting woods, used for Holua boards, fences, house posts and digging sticks. Burns really hot, producing a different color flame. Flowers were woven into leis.
